

NOMELEC Policy and Procedure: Election Timelines

PURPOSE: To establish a timeline for implementation of the PNAH nomination and election process.

POLICY: The PNAH NOMELEC Committee shall enforce strict compliance with established election timelines to ensure that the election of officers is conducted in an organized and timely manner.

PROCEDURE: The NOMELEC Committee shall be responsible for:

- Setting the official election dates and election timelines
- Managing the election process in a timely and efficient manner
- Notifying the PNAH President, Executive Board, candidates and other appropriate individuals of the election timelines and election results.

February 13	Membership Deadline	New or Renewal Membership must be submitted 30 days prior to election. Membership Chair will provide current membership roster as of Feb 13.
March 13	Last Mailed-in Ballots pick up	March 13 - Last day to pick-up mailed-in ballots to be counted on Election Day; postmarked on or before March 13. Campaign period ends.
March 14	Election Day (in-person) Only members on Active Status are allowed to vote	Ballots will be counted after the Education Day. In- person voting stops at 2:00pm
March 21	Post-Election	All issues related to the election has to be resolved 7 days after the election
May 23	2020-2022 Installation	Installation Gala Night

Current PNAA and Chapter Involvement: PNAH Parliamentarian; PNAH Bylaws Committee Chair; PNAH Nursing Excellence Awards Committee Chair; PNAA Bylaws Committee Member

Retired, this 46-year healthcare veteran believes that leadership capability is molded by years of experience, and to become a leader one has to be first a member who is willing to be mentored and learn. 
Fun Facts about Cielito:


